Introduction

Dear friends,
We look back at the year 2024, which was a time of unexpected challenges for the Silesian Diaconate, but also a time full of solidarity and cohesion.

At the beginning of the Year of Prayer and Hope, we had no idea how significant the chosen verse would be for us: "Blessed are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted" (Matthew 5:4). One of the most important achievements was the launch of the reconstruction project of the SAREPTA Home for the Elderly in Komorní Lhotka. The original facilities no longer met the material and technical standards, so we embarked on the largest project in the history of our organisation.

Another key moment that significantly affected the life of the Silesian Diaconate was the September floods. This natural disaster affected our services in the Krnov region and also in Ostrava Nová Ves to a great extent. It caused many millions of dollars of damage and we are still dealing with its consequences today.

However, I am extremely grateful that even in the most difficult moments God's blessing was with us and we were able to cope with the most difficult situations.

About Us

The year of 2024 was filled with interesting activities, opportunities, but also difficult challenges in the Silesian Diaconate. We entered this year thematically as the Year of Prayer and Hope, which we also lived in practice.

Our 112 registered social services have been expanded by the EDEN Outpatient Relief Service in Nový Jičín, which we took over for operation during the year and we have accompanied approximately 10,000 people from the Moravian-Silesian and South Moravian regions in our wide range of services. In the area of social and legal protection of children, we worked with 250 families with children in foster care.

The Volunteer Centre and the Food and Material Aid Centre were able to prove their efficiency in the autumn, when our services in the Krnov region and in Ostrava were affected by devastating floods.

In connection with our efforts to ensure decent and quality conditions for our clients and staff, we have not only been involved in innovative projects or projects to improve the quality of facilities, but we have also focused on processes within the organisation – their digitization and streamlining. Technology can be an enabler in fulfilling our mission and vision, but people are always at the heart of our service – our staff, clients, their families, volunteers and any other cooperating persons and entities. I am very grateful that we can walk this path together, and I thank you very much for that.



Staff

The heart and professionalism of our staff was evident again this year! Our staff bravely faced the consequences of the floods, which hit especially the centres in the Krnov and Bruntál regions and the SILOE Centre in Ostrava. In this difficult situation, other colleagues across our organisation showed great solidarity and willingness to help, and volunteers also assisted significantly.

In addition to this crisis situation, employees were actively involved in the development of the organisation in many other areas. For example, in the area of streamlining internal processes, such as the implementation of purchasing processes, the introduction of the platform for registration of contracts, the development of efficiency and quality of work with social networks, we opened the Community Mental Health Centre in Třinec. Other topics included artificial intelligence and its possible use in our services, strengthening the rights and dignity of clients in residential services and benchmarking.

As part of the Social Services Week, we organised an innovative event called the Week of Good Deeds, which connected pupils and students with our clients and brought a lot of positive energy and good deeds to our services. We would like to thank all our employees for their dedication, professionalism and human approach. We appreciate the effort and commitment they put into their work. Thank you!

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Quality and Education

In the past year, we have focused on the professional development of our employees in the area of quality and education. The quality of our services was developed through support and control activities, methodological meetings, long-term methodological support and professional training. In 2024, we received support from the ČEZ FOUNDATION, which enabled us to innovate some of the quality activities in our organisation and to put the new procedures into practice, in cooperation with both external experts and our methodologists. We have started new activities in relation to the rights and dignity of our clients.

We have become a partner in the implementation of the Soul Support III project, which is implemented by the Regional Authority of the Moravian-Silesian Region. In the project, we are implementing a contract including professional consultations, supervision and coaching. We worked on training activities closely with the Diaconate Institute, which provided 150 training days for our employees. In 2024, one of the major innovations was the launch of the management academy for our senior staff and a series of training sessions for new colleagues.

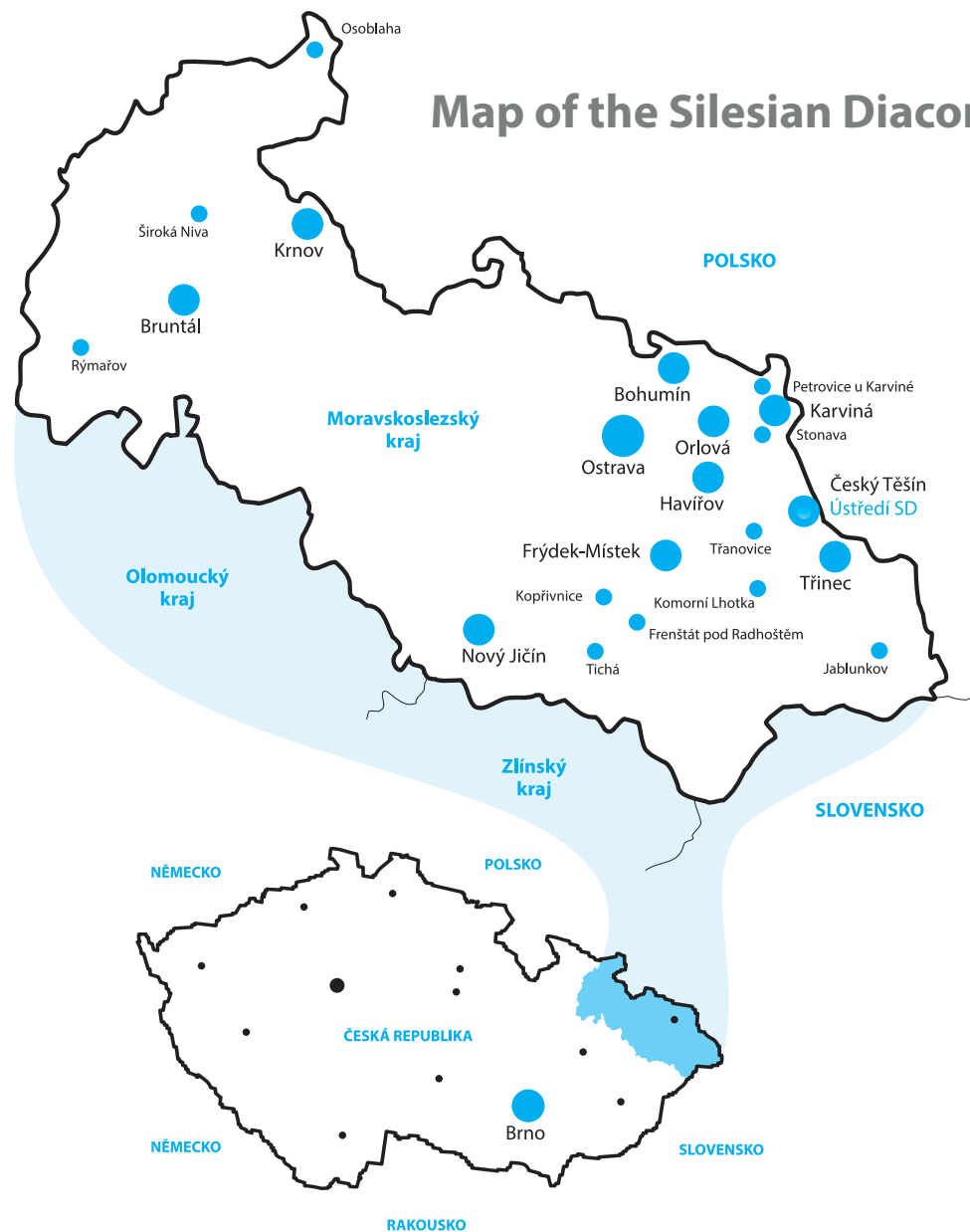

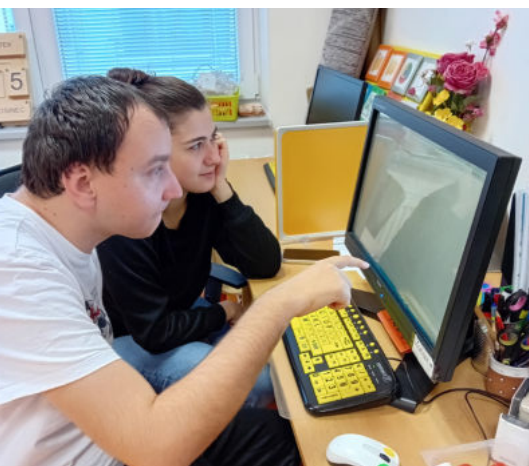
International Volunteering

interVIA – When the heart walks...

A calling to serve people, who are often forgotten, was fulfilled by 36 young people from Europe, Turkey, Jordan and Morocco and more than 80 local, national and international supervisors, partner organisations and other supporters of long-term volunteer service. interVIA is an invitation to embark on a year-long journey and to open oneself to getting to know oneself, other people and the Lord God in everyday moments of one's life. Individual interviews with volunteer supervisors, seminars for volunteers at the beginning, in the middle and at end of the service, as well as learning with peers highlight the uniqueness of a life story that is co-created through time spent together in dialogue, belonging and solidarity. In 2024, we continued to build our brand on

social media and our website. Through them, we want to arouse curiosity and stimulate interest in participating in a community of people united by values such as justice, individual dignity and respect for diversity. The good news from Brussels – we were awarded the quality label for voluntary activities in developing countries. We share the joy of working with our partners in the EDYN network and with NEVSO in the field of lobbying. We hosted an international group of multidisciplinary workers who cooperate with international volunteers from various countries, not only from the EU. The participants from countries such as Lebanon and Egypt had the opportunity to get to know the Silesian Diocese, the special diaconal education and also how the SD supports and develops international volunteering. Meetings with both MEP Michaela Šojdová at the European Parliament in Brussels and with our volunteers in Těšín in the Czech Republic undoubtedly contributed to raising the profile of the importance and impact of volunteering. Our vision is that the dream “When the heart walks...” will come true for people who feel called to co-create life in its fullness through the interVIA programmes. And this is how we can kindle the fire of hope in the lives around us.

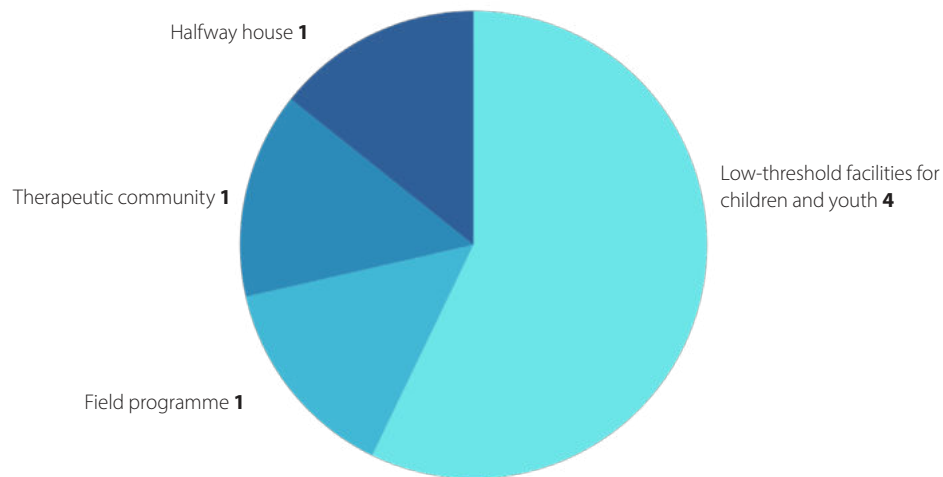

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TIMOTEI BRUNTÁL **Halfway House**

Jirka grew up in a family that was far from ideal, which had an impact on his childhood. Until he was nine years old, he lived with his parents and two siblings, but he was not raised in a loving way and his parents did not take enough interest in him. At the age of seven, he began attending a special school and speech therapy, where the focus was put on improving his communication skills. Although he was performing well in school, communication problems and frustrations were building up. At the age of nine, his life changed dramatically when he was placed in the Children's Home in Litovel and later in the Children's Home in Velké Heraltice. He began to look for ways to cope with frustrations in these facilities. Unfortunately, he chose the path of aggression and bullying. His behaviour, of which he said that he enjoyed it, was his reaction to his anger and helplessness. During this difficult time, Jirka also began to face deep psychological problems, which led him to several suicide attempts. After the last one, he spent six months in a psychiatric hospital, where he tried to process his past and find a new direction. Jirka was strongly affected by

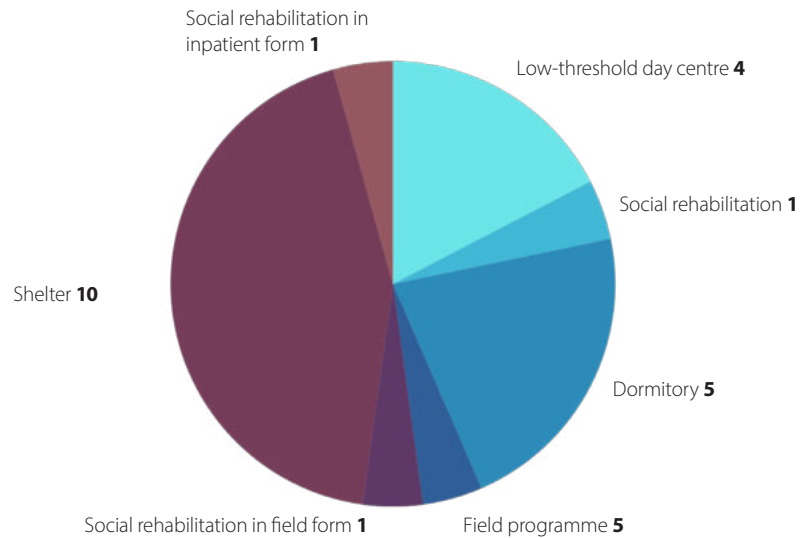
this difficult experience, but it also gave him the opportunity to start a new stage in his life. After finishing the primary school, Jirka continued his education and became a gardener. He enjoyed this work, since it allowed him to find peace and a way to cope with stress. After finishing his studies, a social worker arranged for him to live in the Halfway House in Bruntál, where he decided to study to become a cook/waiter. This step brought new opportunities to him and he began to focus more on stability and the future. After the graduation, Jirka registered with the Labour Office and began working part-time, gaining the necessary experience and perseverance to maintain a stable life. There was a key worker who helped Jirka in all areas of his life. They worked together to improve money management, stabilize employment and improve relationships with others. The worker provided him with the necessary support and helped him maintain direction. Given his competence, he was assigned a flat in the Halfway House, which was an important step towards his independence. He worked as a volunteer at the Pohoda Home, where he eventually became a maintenance worker. Even though he sometimes had difficulty getting up in the morning and cooperating with authority, he found his work fulfilling. However, he still longed to live in the big city. With the support of the worker, Jirka got a job and housing in Mladá Boleslav. He found a girlfriend in his new town, with whom he lives together and works in a local car manufacturing plant.

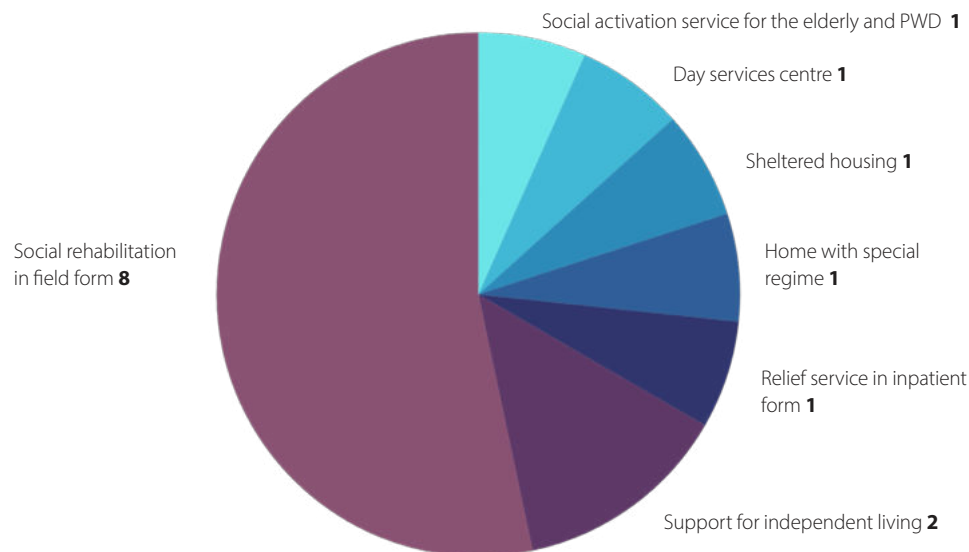
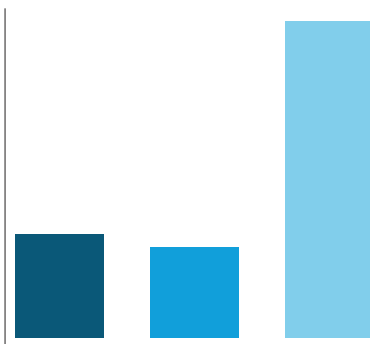
Mrs Halina (her name was changed) is an elderly woman who, at a certain time in her life, found herself in a difficult situation. She used the services of our low-threshold day centre, where she built relationships with the workers and other clients. One day, another client mentioned concerns about her health. He told us that Mrs Halina has been staying at a friend's flat for the past few days, but has been acting strangely and outwardly confused. He thought she must have fallen somewhere and something happened to her. Our staff attempted to contact the client, but found it very difficult to communicate with her. She barely spoke and kept repeating one sentence: "I care..." It was obvious that something serious was going on with her. After repeated attempts and a very complicated discussion, we managed to accompany the client to her GP who, after an initial examination, suspected a stroke. He immediately recommended her admission to the neurology ward, where she was brought with the help of our workers. Eventually, the diagnosis was confirmed and appropriate treatment was initiated. The doctor confirmed that the stroke, which affected mainly the speech centre of the brain, was so

critical that the effects would be severe and permanent. Throughout the process, Mrs Halina benefited from our intensive support. We accompanied her to the medical appointments, assisted her during the hospitalization, and when she began to recover, we began to figure out the next steps together. It was necessary to arrange speech therapy and later rehabilitation care, as well as social issues, such as the registration and status with the Labour Office and the applying for material need benefits. The client gradually regained partial communication skills and, with our support, she started to believe in the possibility of a more independent life. As part of the next plan, the issue of housing was raised. The client's situation was specific – ordinary social services would not meet her individual needs. At the same time, however, it was clear that she could no longer return to her previous way of life. Finally, thanks to excellent cooperation with the Social Department of the town of Český Těšín, we managed to secure the possibility of a training flat and the client is currently preparing for life in her own flat. Workers help her adapt to independent living, select appropriate social and health support services and stabilize her finances. We are grateful to God that we were able to help Mrs Halina in the early detection of health complications and the emerging adverse social situation, when otherwise she could have remained without help. Thanks to early intervention and systematic support, we managed not only to stabilize her health condition, but also to open a new path to a better and more independent life.

RÚT TŘINEC **Rehabilitation**

We met Veronika for the first time at the CNS clinic in the hospital in Třinec, where she was taken on Christmas Eve after her mother died unexpectedly. Due to her limited legal capacity and experience of mental illness, Veronika was later hospitalized in a psychiatric hospital in Opava. The loss of her mother affected Veronika very much, they led a closed and monotonous life without social contacts and there was no one in the family to whom Veronika could turn. She didn't understand why she had to leave her flat where she was used to living and which she liked. Unfortunately, her current mental state did not allow her to live independently at that time. We visited her in the hospital in Třinec and in Opava, gradually getting to know each other and finding out about Veronika's skills and abilities.

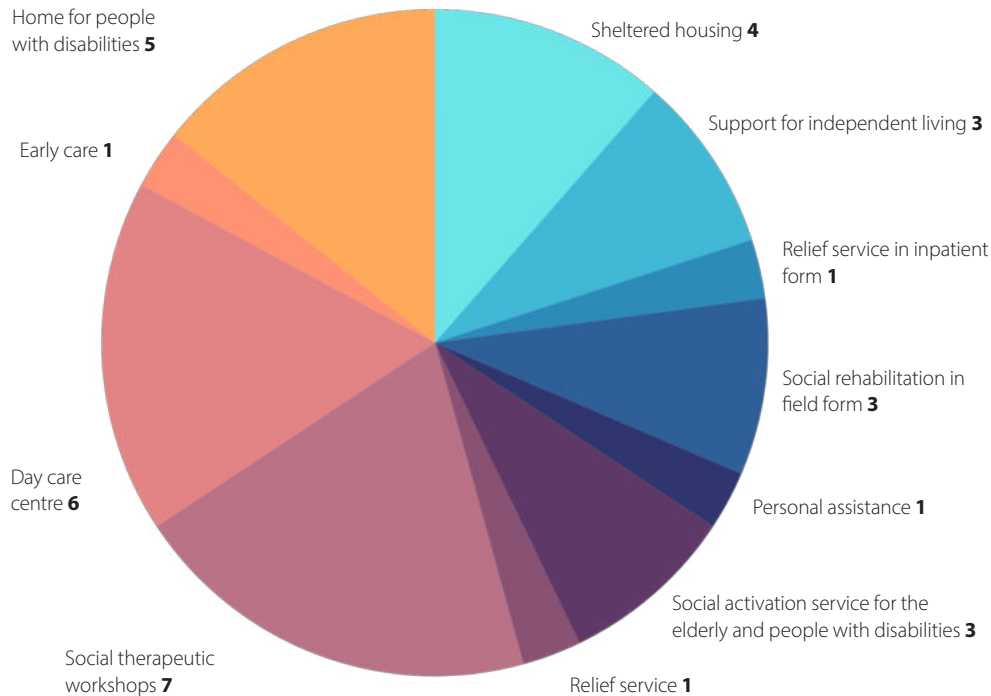
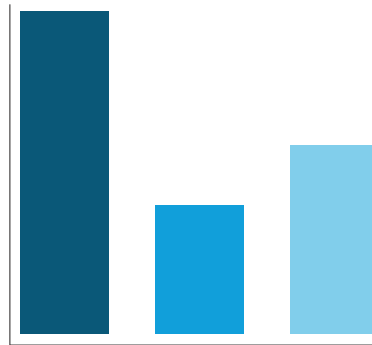

Together with Veronika, the medical staff and the guardian, we looked for ways to set up appropriate support so that she could go back home. After several months, everyone's efforts paid off and Veronika is now back in her flat. She draws support from the RÚT Social Rehabilitation in Třinec and the NOE Support Independent Living. The training focuses on household care, travelling in the city and using a mobile phone. Mrs Veronika is also supported in meeting her peers and in spending her free time in a meaningful way, which she manages to fulfil thanks to the JORDÁN Social Activation Service. Mrs Veronica's greatest wish came true, and as she says: “Home is home”.

Day Care Centre

My Child Isn't Healthy, But We Live a Beautiful Life

My son was born in 1990 and, in consequence of a poorly managed birth, he is not healthy. It was very hard at first, especially accepting the fact that life was just going to be different for everyone. But that certainly doesn't mean that it will be worse. The first helper was one doctor from Ostrava who recommended the rehabilitation hospital in Ostrava-Poruba, where we went to learn the Vojta method and met specialist doctors. Until then, the general practitioner had not addressed my son's condition at all, even though it was obvious that the child's development was not good. We started with the rehabilitation 4 times a day for 20 minutes. It was challenging, and every parent who has been through this knows that the progress is very slow. We were lucky then, because our son went to the Special Education Centre in Nový Jičín, where they were wonderful. He found new friends there and I found friends among parents who are in a similar situation. We were able to meet and share experience, encourage each other and not give up. Now my son attends the EDEN Day Care Centre in Nový Jičín-Žilina four times a week, where he has friends and assistants helping him with everything that's necessary. "Eden" means paradise and for us it really is paradise! I would like to thank all the employees for their empathetic approach and the effort that they put into their work with our "big" children.

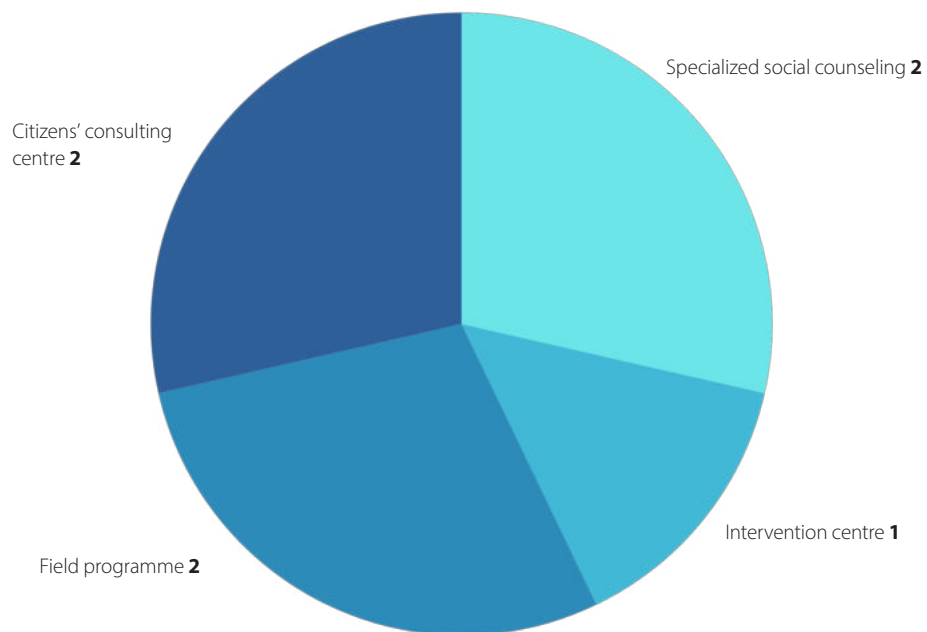
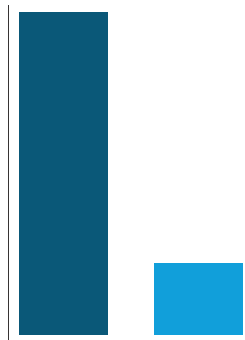
How do the assistants see it?

We experience many nice things, whether it's creating with different materials, working in the garden, discussions or trips and other "outdoor" events. We are glad that Honza is looking forward to joining us in the Day Care Centre.

OBČANSKÁ PORADNA KARVINÁ

Specialized Social Counseling

Mrs Kateřina was desperate and didn't know what to do, so she turned to the Citizens' Consulting Centre in Karviná. Until recently, she had a beautiful relationship with her granddaughter—they spent weekends together, went for walks and shared moments that meant a lot to them. But when the parents divorced, everything changed. The child's mother began to prevent the father from having contact with his daughter and, along with that, the relationship between Mrs Kateřina and her granddaughter was severed. She had suddenly lost someone who was extremely important to her, and she felt helpless. Mrs Kateřina tried to find a way to resolve the situation. She tried to talk to her daughter-in-law, to find a way to bond with the child. But every time she was met with a dismissive attitude. When she came to the Citizens' Consulting Centre, it was obvious how much the situation was bothering her. The counsellor listened to her with understanding and together they discussed how she could proceed. It wasn't just about her legal options—it was also important to find a way to restore decent and respectful communication with her daughter-in-law. They talked about how important good

family relationships are and how everyone can benefit from them, especially the granddaughter herself. Trying to put yourself in the other party's perspective for a while, to understand their fears and feelings, can be the first step towards finding common ground. The counsellor recommended that Mrs Kateřina try again to reach out to her daughter-in-law—this time with an emphasis on mutual respect and the welfare of the child. If she didn't make any progress, she could contact the Department of Social and Legal Protection of Children, where they could help with further action. As the last resort, a legal route was mentioned—filing a petition with the court to regulate contact with the granddaughter. After careful consideration, Mrs Kateřina decided to use this option. Together with the counsellor, they went through a model petition that helped her better understand the process. She not only received the necessary support and guidance in drafting the petition, but also assistance in submitting it to the court. Mrs Kateřina left with a heavy heart, but with faith that she could change the situation. She knew that the road to rebuilding a relationship with her granddaughter would not be easy. But at the same time, she realized she wasn't completely helpless. That there are steps that she can take. And most importantly, she's not alone. Sometimes, it is enough to find someone who listens to you and looks for solutions with you.

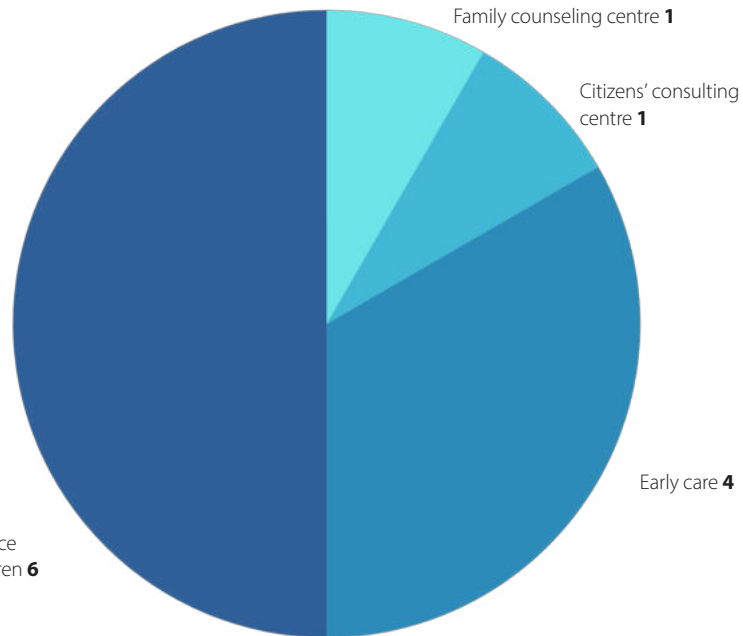
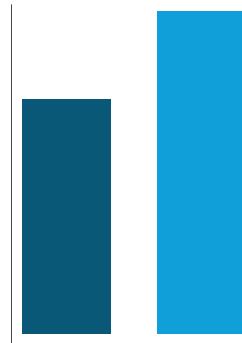

ACTIVATION CENTRE FOR FAMILIES IN ADDICTION

Stezka

Zdenka has been dealing with addiction issues since she was a young girl. She first started experimenting with alcohol at the age of 13. Alcohol gradually became a means of escape from the difficult family situation and the problems that accompanied her adolescence. She has been very insecure in relationships since puberty and has repeatedly found herself in toxic ones. She failed to establish healthy, stable relationships and her partners often shared a pattern of risky behaviour similar to her own. One of them was the father of her son, with whom she began experimenting with methamphetamine. However, after several attempts to use the drug, she found that it had a negative effect on her and decided to avoid it. With the birth of Dominik, Zdenka hoped for a change. She saw motherhood as an opportunity for a fresh start and a chance to create a stable life. She worked intensively with the Activation Centre for Families in Addiction—Stezka, seeking to understand her own patterns of addictive behaviour and learning relapse prevention techniques. However, she still struggled with her weaknesses, especially her ability to refuse substance use. She thus found herself in a vicious circle. She was

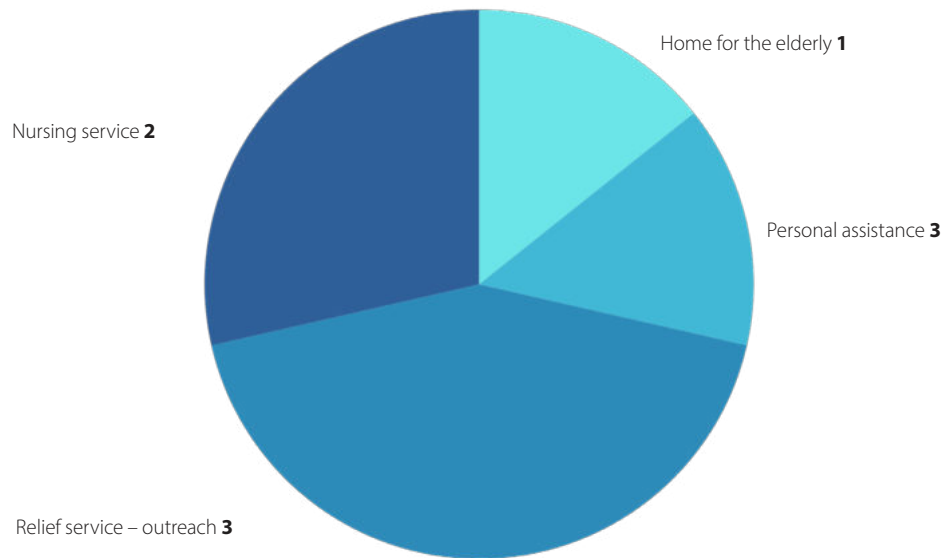
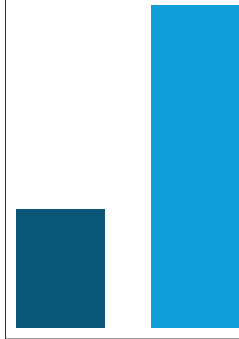
experiencing feelings of hopelessness and her deep-seated addiction was still controlling her. Alcohol use led to situations where she could not deal with childcare. Dominik witnessed Zdenka being under the influence of alcohol several times, and Zdenka was repeatedly getting into risky situations. She didn't even remember some of them later. The critical moment came when she woke up after one of these situations and Dominic was nowhere to be found. Police took him away from her after she was found intoxicated in a public place. For Zdenka, this moment was a major turning point. The client realized that if she didn't change her life, she risked losing her son forever. She decided to take a radical step and, in cooperation with Stezka, applied for admission to a therapeutic community—a special programme for mothers with children, where she remains today. After the end of treatment, we will continue to work with Zdenka and provide her with support in the area of abstinence (relapse prevention), but also, for example, help with finding a job. As part of the therapeutic programme, she expressed interest in the possibility of becoming a peer consultant in the future. This idea motivates her and gives her a sense of purpose. Zdenka believes that, thanks to her own experience, she can be a support and inspiration for others who find themselves in a similarly difficult life situation. Zdenka's story shows that even seemingly hopeless situations can lead to positive change, if one finds enough motivation and support. Her determination and gradual progress give hope for a better future, not only for her but also for her son.

We Only Live Once, or Living with Dementia

DEMENTIA FRIENDLY COMMUNITY IN THE MORAVIAN-SILESIA REGION

Since 2024, we have been implementing the “Dementia Friendly Community in the Moravian-Silesian Region” project in the Ostrava and Pobeškydí regions. Why? There are many people around living with dementia and their carers. We cannot cure dementia, so it is important to try to create the most pleasant environment for these people to live in. In the project, we support and accompany people living with dementia and their loved ones and try to change the perception of dementia in our society. We will show you what it can be like with the story of Mr Vašek and his family. Mr Vašek moved to Ostrava while studying at the university, met his wife Helenka, started a family and raised two daughters. Mr Vašek worked as an engineer at the mine and later as a teacher at the high school. A few years ago, the family began to notice that Mr Vašek was not coping with everything as he used to and was forgetting more. Thanks to their attentiveness, they were able to reach the specialists who diagnosed Alzheimer’s disease in time. At that time, Mr Vašek was good with the computer and had learned a lot about his illness. It wasn’t a bright prospect.

The family pulled together and actively sought further support. And thanks to that we were able to begin our cooperation. Since April, our colleagues have been regularly visiting the family and providing support to Mr Vašek, his wife Helena and their daughter. Talking, sharing or even playing chess together helped to build mutual trust and reinforce his strengths. All this helped Mr Vašek to make a speech in the summer cinema before the screening of a film about living with dementia. He talked about his life and how he didn’t see his condition as a disease: “Only my brain is full, nothing new can be added.” Especially for his wife, Mr Vašek’s ability to speak so publicly was a great surprise, and the opportunity to go to the cinema together after many years pleased them both. “We only live once, and there is no trial. We can share everything with our family, both the joys and the sorrows. We can support each other if we want to.” These words resonated for a long time and prove that people living with dementia are a full part of their families and society.

“NOVÝ PROSTOR” Project

In 2024, the clients of the BETHEL Centre in Český Těšín were involved in a new project—the launch of the socially supportive magazine “Nový prostor” (New Space). It is known mainly in Prague, Brno, Olomouc and Ostrava. Český Těšín is thus the first smaller town where the sale was launched. Involvement in the sale of the magazine requires our clients—homeless people—to do a lot of planning and take personal responsibility. In short, the retailer sells current copies of the magazine “Nový prostor” for 80 CZK to the general public as a “newsboy”. With the money earned, he buys more magazines at an output price of 40 CZK, which he resells at his point of sale. Thus, for every magazine sold, the net profit is half the selling price. However, the retailer must be able to manage his funds so that he has a financial reserve to buy more numbers. Mr František, who is a pioneer of sales in Český Těšín, sells the magazine before and after services at the church in Masaryk Gardens. Mrs Alena, who is really good at selling, addresses passers-by around the train station. In 2024, retailers in Český Těšín sold a total of 627 copies of the magazine.

LYDIE Český Těšín, Early Care Counselling

In 2024, the LYDIE Early Care Counselling Centre in Český Těšín focused on quality, on the training of the counsellors and their expertise. The early care is the first social service that enters families who need help, support and counselling on their child’s development, on a need and voluntary basis. When working with parents and children with disabilities, the early care works at the borderline of special education, psychological, social and sometimes even medical fields, and, therefore, the service must continuously follow new trends and educate counsellors to a high standard in all fields. Our workplace has undergone a quality survey and, since 11 July 2024, has been a holder of the Early Care Service Quality Guarantee, which is awarded by the Early Care Association of the Czech Republic on the basis of the survey. In evaluating the provision of this service, the inspection praised the direct work in the family, human approach and professionalism. We received 100% of the points. Our early care is 80% dedicated to children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and is the only one in the MSR working with the family using the O. T. A. early intervention method (identified in M-CHAT).



The Innovative BETHEL Třinec

For the BETHEL Centre in Třinec, the year of 2024 was quite intense. The most significant activity was the implementation of the project of the MSR, helping an unsightly and uninteresting building became a building that even won 3rd place in the Building of the Year competition, announced annually by the city of Třinec. Thanks to the project, the Centre received not only insulation, but also a new, decent façade. In 2024, the BETHEL Centre in Třinec, including an asylum, a social rehabilitation, a low—threshold day centre and a field programme, continued its cooperation with schools in Třinec, where pupils and students had the opportunity to visit the Centre. It was a great opportunity to show young people the services for homeless people and to talk to them about homelessness, its causes and manifestations in general. The visits were followed by discussions in schools with a field worker who once found himself on the streets but managed to get back on his feet, and thus his story is a real inspiration. Both the visits to the Centre and the discussions in schools were carried out in cooperation with Vlastimil Starzyk, a social worker and prevention officer from the Social Affairs Department of the city of Třinec.



Celebrations in Frýdek-Místek and Třinec Region

In 2024, three services in the Frýdek-Místek and Třinec region celebrated the round anniversary of their foundation. In spring, the JORDÁN Social Activation Service in Třinec reached its 20th anniversary. The celebration took place in a pleasant atmosphere with the participation of clients and staff, as well as former clients, staff and volunteers. In the autumn, two social services celebrated their round anniversaries. The first of them was the ELPIS Counselling Centre in Třinec, which celebrated 20 years since its foundation. The staff combined the anniversary with a beautiful idea—a charity workshop. During the workshop, the proceeds of which went to support the reconstruction of the SAREPTA Home for the Elderly, participants learned the macramé technique. The ARCHA Sheltered Housing in Třinec celebrated with the staff, co-workers and clients of the service ten years since its foundation. The past decade was remembered, among other things, through a presentation of photographs that reminded us of the progress made in these ten years.





Floods at the SILOE Ostrava

In September 2024, an extraordinary event hit the SILOE Centre in Ostrava. The centre was affected by the floods despite the efforts of fire-fighters and volunteers. Thanks to the early warning, we managed to evacuate the clients and the necessary equipment safely to the premises of the RAINBOW HOUSE (DUHOVÝ DŮM) in Ostrava. The Czech Red Cross from Ostrava demonstrated professionalism and empathy during this event.

In the following days, an extraordinary wave of solidarity emerged. Many volunteers worked tirelessly to help with the flood relief efforts. The Moravian-Silesian Region promptly arranged alternative premises in the Home under the White Mountain (Domov pod Bílou horou) in Kopřivnice, where our clients found temporary shelter.

Our staff showed extraordinary dedication, working as a cohesive team in the crisis situation with a commitment to help. The clients' families were also a great support. Thanks to the great efforts and financial support of the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs, the necessary repairs were made and the main building was put back into operation. The clients of the residential services were thus able to spend Christmas back at the SILOE Centre. This challenging ordeal has shown the power of mutual aid and human solidarity.

Cause I Live With All My Senses

To watch a child at play, in joyful movement or inquisitive exploration of the world, and to rejoice in his progress—that's every parent's desire. But for some parents, it's less obvious. Children and young people with autism need to overcome many obstacles to develop and enjoy everyday things, such as having fun at the playground. It is for them that, thanks to the support of the MSR, the City of Bohumín and generous donors, we were able to start in 2024 the reconstruction of the unused and unsuitable premises of the outdated hydrotherapy and sauna into three new specialised rooms for sensory activities: a sensory integration gym and a light and dark relaxation room, the so-called Snoezelen. Targeted activities in a safe environment will help children and young adults with disabilities, most often autism, to develop and participate in society. We are already looking forward to completing, renovating and equipping the premises so that we can help even more effectively.





New Relief Service EDEN Nový Jičín: More Than Just a Weekend Getaway

Since August 2024, the EDEN Centre in Nový Jičín has been alive with new energy on weekends—thanks to a new relief service that offers children and adults with mental and combined disabilities (especially those with ASD) not only care, but above all experiences, creativity and joy. Each weekend was unique and full of activities that combine creativity, relaxation and discovering new things. Throughout the year, the clients could create, paint, make Christmas cookies or Italian pizza together. They enjoyed aromatherapy, music therapy and relaxation in the relaxation room. But they didn't just stay indoors—they went out, explored their surroundings and enjoyed moving around. The weekend of lights and shadows was a great success, where the clients made a shadow theatre together and explored how shadows change. In 2024, this service enabled us not only to support families, but most importantly to bring joy, new skills and many wonderful experiences to our clients.

Welfare Activities for Employees = Quality Care for Clients

Our employees are as important to us as our clients. Only a happy and healthy team can provide the best care. Therefore, in 2024, we have prepared a range of activities for our employees to support their physical and mental well-being. The traditional Day of Silence provided a space for calm and regeneration, while the creation in the EFFATHA Workshops helped to strengthen teamwork. In May, we took part in the May Challenge, where we not only supported selected projects, but also improved our own health. The guided tour of the Nový Jičín region took us through the history of social services in the region and enriched us with new knowledge. We ended the year with a joint service with our employees and clients where we remembered the values of mutual support and solidarity.





What the Floods Took Away...

In September 2024, the floods severely affected our social services in Krnov and Albrechtice. The water element was strong and ruthless. The affected municipalities will still be recovering over the next year. In our centres, we lost some equipment and the buildings and gardens were damaged. But what the flood took away, it gave back in the form of staff cohesion and the selfless help of good people. It has given us the confidence that we can rely on each other and our colleagues. That we all know how to contribute and pull together to get services up and running for our clients as quickly as possible. We are grateful to the Lord God for the protective hand and strength He has provided us with, as we have dealt with the aftermath of the floods, both in the services and in our homes. We are also grateful for the support of the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs, because thanks to the subsidies we are able to return the service facilities to the level they were at before the floods.

Social Rehabilitation and Multidisciplinary Team in Bruntál Region

At the end of 2024, the RÚT Social Rehabilitation in Bruntál moved to new premises. Now it is situated in the same building as the psychiatrists, so the service is even closer to people with mental illness. The social rehabilitation is part of the assistance on the client's path to understanding their illness, early recognition of relapse symptoms, managing difficulties in their natural environment and thus preventing hospitalization. Clients of the social rehabilitation are supported in getting a job or education, in securing housing, in spending their free time, in cultivating hobbies and interests, and in establishing relationships, so that they can live a happy life despite the limitations caused by their illness. Since 2021, a multidisciplinary team for people with mental illness has been operating in the Bruntál region within the social rehabilitation. The team includes not only a social worker, psychologist, psychiatrist or psychiatric nurse, but also a peer counsellor, a person who has had their own experience of mental illness and can therefore understand the recovery journey the client is going through.





EUNIKA Karviná Day Care Centre is Once Again Closer to People

Introducing innovative working methods and tools definitely pays off. We have seen that in the EUNIKA Day Care Centre in Karviná. Having purchased a suspended ceiling system at the end of the last year, the service has seen great benefit from this assistive technology in the following year 2024. After introducing the technology into the normal operation of the service, the composition of the Day Care Centre clients also changed. The needs, abilities and skills of existing clients have been reassessed and some have started to use social therapy workshops instead of day care for their further development. With the change in the target group, three new clients were recruited during 2024 who can now benefit from a high level of support. They receive regular care and support in the stimulating Day Care Centre. New clients started using the service thanks to the suspended ceiling system. As the suspended system has a great variability, in September 2024, an accessory for verticalization and training of the correct walking stereotype was purchased, which allowed immobile clients to experience walking on the ground for the first time.

From Shelter to Flat

After long negotiations with Heimstaden, the Silesian Diacolate managed to exchange the entrance with rental flats for another, more suitable for housing. From August 2024, social rental housing will be located in Karviná – Nové Město on Družby street. The Silesian Diacolate owns eight flats, where one of them is undergoing the process of new approval inspection as an office for field workers. The flats are spacious, bright, all 1st category. Several former clients of the BETHEL Shelter have managed to find adequate quality housing here. Four men returned to normal life also thanks to the support of our social workers. The residents of other flats are also offered occasional social counselling by field workers, to the extent that they know that they are not alone in their worries and more difficult life situations.





Home is Where ...

The BETEZDA Home in Komorní Lhotka is a place with a rich history of diaconal work, where we celebrated 30 years of our modern activity. Thirty years is an impressive period of time during which we have provided help and care to 59 people. 6 supervisors, 5 social workers, 53 social service workers, 4 nurses, 5 cleaning workers, 4 maintenance workers and 8 men in civilian military service accompanied us on our journey. These thirty years have made us think about what home means to us. We completed our question with photographs, and the exhibition entitled "HOME IS WHERE ..." was created. The exhibition is not only a visual experience, but also a story about life, relationships and everyday existence. We thank Pavel Pluhař for capturing the stories and all those who participated in the project. Each photograph tells its own story. Some of the photographs are full of energy and life, while others radiate calm and tranquillity. Some photographs capture clients during activities, others during rest. The photographs together create a mosaic of the message HOME IS WHERE... I belong, I have my space, I am learning new things, I am happy....

New Facilities for Helping Others

After more than 15 years, the social services in Frýdek-Místek changed their location. The NOE Support for Independent Living in Frýdek-Místek, the RÚT Social Rehabilitation in Frýdek-Místek and the EFFATHA Social-therapeutic Workshops in Frýdek-Místek moved from Frýdek to Místek. The new facilities are located in a two-storey building with a lift, where each service enjoys its own space for clients and staff, including small kitchens and consultation rooms. All three services work closely together to offer clients a wide range of activities tailored to their needs. Together with clients, we develop common household care skills, provide occupational therapy, reinforce positive habits and work to achieve as much independence as possible in different areas of life. We believe that our services can help many people, so we try to bring them closer to the public. We visit schools where we talk openly with young people about the importance of physical and mental health, about the possibilities of finding a place in society and on the labour market, and about the possibilities of interdisciplinary cooperation. We work closely with companies in the city in the field of occupational therapy. This allows clients to go directly into a real work environment for internships, which helps them gain valuable experience and skills. In some cases, the internships can develop into a full employment relationship.





DOREA, ELIADA and RÚT in the South Moravian Region

In 2024, the DOREA Early Care Counselling Centre welcomed 53 new families, so we supported a total of 178 families with children with special needs. The ELIADA Personal Assistance in Brno provided regular services to 30 clients, including Saturday leisure activities and a summer day camp. Last year, the RÚT Social Rehabilitation in Brno supported 30 clients in the areas of employment, housing, education and leisure time, and organised joint meetings with cooking and trips to the farm. In May, in spite of the bad weather, the staff of the Brno Section organised a traditional garden festival for the clients' families of all services. A total of 14 volunteers helped us with our operations during the year. We continued to develop conceptual and strategic cooperation with partners and to link the social sector with the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports. One of the most important challenges for the Brno Section in the future, apart from securing sustainable funding, is the search for suitable common spaces. In 2025, we will celebrate 20 years since the foundation of the Brno Section in the South Moravian Region, which fills us with gratitude and joy of our meaningful work.

MIRABEL and HOMESHARING

For the Brno Section, the year of 2024 was, among other things, a year of hard work on the implemented innovations. The MIRABEL Development Centre offered two more services to families with children with special needs: neuro-developmental stimulation and the unique Arno Stern Art Studio. The new premises were reconstructed at 21 Kamenná street in Brno; in May, we equipped and inaugurated the premises with the support of the City of Brno, the South Moravian Region and foundations. Shared care—homesharing—brings great enrichment to children and significant relief to parents of children with intellectual disabilities. Today, 10 children in the South Moravian Region have their own volunteer host (three others are being matched) and 41 families are waiting for this valuable form of support. We are also delighted that, in 2024, thanks to an EU grant, we were able to strengthen our team with two female support workers. In cooperation with other providers of shared care in the Czech Republic, we established the Community for Homesharing, under the banner of which the first conference on homesharing for a professional audience took place in Prague. We have been recruiting hosts for more families and presenting the concept of homesharing to the public also in 2025.



Fund-raising in the Silesian Diaconate



In many ways, our work would not be possible without the support of donors who contribute to specific or innovative projects, to the standard operation of our services, as well as to emergency and crisis situations. Reconstruction of the SAREPTA Komorní Lhotka Home for the Elderly

Since 2023, the Silesian Diaconate has been running a public fund-raiser for the reconstruction of the SAREPTA Home for the Elderly in Komorní Lhotka, the aim of which is to secure funds for the completion of the reconstruction. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we have already raised CZK 700,000 in our fund-raising account, for which we thank you very much. Every donation, whether direct to the fund-raising account 107-1593460217, or through the purchase of fictitious building materials in the POSTAVMESAREPTU.CZ e-shop, is a valuable support for us on our way to creating a modern and dignified home for the elderly. Thanks to a subsidy from the National Recovery Plan of CZK 80 million and the support of other entities in the amount of CZK 10 million, we have already secured a large part of the funding. Nevertheless, we are still CZK 30 million short, which is the amount necessary for completing the reconstruction of CZK 120 million.



Floods in 2024

After the devastating floods in the Krnov and Ostrava regions in the autumn of 2024, a public fund-raiser was announced to support the services of the Silesian Diaconate in dealing with the consequences of the disaster. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to raise nearly CZK 800 000, which is being used to rebuild the infrastructure and ensure the operation of our social services that were severely affected by the floods. At the same time, another fund-raiser was organised via "Darujme.cz" to support the SILOE Centre in Ostrava, where CZK 174,000 was raised. Thank you to everyone who participated in these fund-raisers! Your support has helped us not only in the rapid restoration of material damage, but also in providing quality care for those who need our help the most. We believe that together we will overcome this difficult situation and gradually restore all the services that are essential for our clients.

Project Activity

In 2024, the Silesian Diaconate kept implementing the key projects aimed at supporting people in need. We have progressed in the reconstruction of the SAREPTA Home for the Elderly in Komorní Lhotka and have implemented a number of projects that contribute to the provision of quality services. Thanks to EU funding, we received a vehicle for the therapeutic community that helps young people aged 14 and over, within the “Car for EXIT” project.

We created new rooms for sensory integration of children in the SALOME Social Activation Service in Bohumín and also provided air conditioning for part of the premises in the RAINBOW HOUSE in Ostrava, thanks to the support of the Programme for the Support of the Quality Improvement of the Social Services in the Moravian-Silesian Region. With the support of the region, we were able to repair and partially reconstruct some of our buildings. In the South Moravian Region, the successful Homesharing project, which supports mutually beneficial cooperation between volunteers and families with a child with a disability, continued. We have started the implementation of the project “Dementia Friendly Community in the Moravian-Silesian Region”, which supports the creation of a friendly and accessible environment for people with this disease and their loved ones.



Building Modifications of the SAREPTA Komorní Lhotka Home for the Elderly

The largest project of the Silesian Diaconate, which is the comprehensive reconstruction of the Home for the Elderly in Komorní Lhotka, is a project that the Silesian Diaconate has been striving for since 2016. The key impulse for the start of the reconstruction was the approval of a subsidy of almost CZK 80 million from the National Recovery Plan. The reconstruction includes not only major changes to the layout and interior, but also exterior changes that will not only transform the look of the home, but also lead to significant energy savings. Accessibility, modernisation and improved facilities are just some of the reasons why this project is so important to us. Soon SAREPTA will be home again to 60 seniors in 42 single and 9 double rooms. We look forward to this space once again offering seniors a safe place where they can live a dignified and happy life, surrounded by quality care and respect.

CAUSE I Live with All My Senses!

The project aims to provide support for children and young people with disabilities, including autism spectrum disorders. The social activation service provides individual care and development programme for children from 2 to 11 years old and young people up to 26 years old, facing challenges in communication and integration into society. With the help of donors and volunteers, a special space for sensory integration was built in the SALOME Social Activation Service in Bohumín, which will enable even more effective support and improvement of the daily life of the children. Through intensive individual care and cooperation with families, children develop in a natural environment and have the opportunity to participate in training and development activities that help them to integrate into everyday life.

Programme for Foster Families



Every child deserves to grow up in an environment that supports their uniqueness, needs and dreams. Our goal is to accompany foster families so that the care they provide to children is not only safe and stable, but also natural and adapted to their individual stories. In 2024, we stood alongside 287 families, providing counselling, helping children build healthy identities and fostering their ties with their original family. We have provided day and short-term care and made a wide range of educational programmes available to foster carers. This year, also, eight caregivers successfully completed long-term training in the Therapeutic Parenting. With the support of the J&T Foundation, we provided the families with professional and therapeutic assistance. The J&T Foundation also supported the supervision and professional development of our workers. We also prepared support activities for four adoptive families. Teenagers in fos-

ter care need a space where they can develop their skills, share experiences and prepare for independent living. With the support of the Moravian-Silesian Region, we organised 19 club meetings focused on self-development and experiential education, involving a total of 49 teenagers. A weekend retreat for 15 teens brought new perspectives and inspiration for the future. We also supported 12 young adults leaving foster care and seeking a path to independence. Many thanks to the ING BANK Fund of the Tereza Maxová Foundation, which enabled us to provide tutoring to children who needed help at school. This work would not be possible without you – our supporters, colleagues and families who put their trust in us. Every story that turns into a safe and loving home thanks to foster parents is proof that our joint efforts are worthwhile. Thank you for being with us.

The Year of Prayer and Hope was full of unexpected events for the Silesian Diaconate schools, but also full of God's great grace. New classes were created across the branches of the school in Těšín – in kindergarten, primary and secondary school, and the school in Krnov managed to acquire a nine-seater car for transporting pupils. All branches of the primary school in Těšín continued with the Breakfast Clubs, and the Coaches to Schools project continued in Krnov. Both schools implemented the P JAC templates, and pupils again won awards in the art competition “Prayer for Home” on the theme of Hope. The secondary school in Český Těšín formally completed the project “Following the Těšín Tram Tracks”. Traditionally, school concerts were held, in May, the Ostrava branch took over the organisation, and the pupils of the Krnov school performed at an Advent concert. A common part of the activities were visits to the town libraries, salt caves, canine-assisted therapy or hippotherapy.

The pupils also participated in performances for the elderly and once again took part in a nationwide event “Drum Night” aimed at preventing violence against children.

The staff training focused largely on augmentative and alternative communication methods. As part of the “Digitization of Schools” project, special communication software was purchased in Krnov, and the school in Těšín also expanded its digital aids to support the prevention of the digital divide. Two female workers were awarded for their many years of creative pedagogical activity.

The new management of the Krnov school had to deal with the consequences of the September floods, which left huge damage to the school buildings and their equipment. A big thank you to all the donors across the country who have fulfilled the biblical verse “Bear ye one another's burdens” with their selfless help to the school. The isolated workplaces of the Těšín school were either avoided by the floods, or the floods literally stopped at the door. Prayerfully, we've been able to experience repeatedly the hope that the Lord God blesses and protects our work.

Management of the Silesian Diaconate in 2024

The year 2024 was a period of stable and successful management for the Silesian Diaconate. We have managed not only to secure funding for the operation of our services, but also to use the available resources efficiently and cost-effectively.

COST STRUCTURE

The distribution of costs has remained relatively stable in recent years. The largest item is wage costs, which in 2024 amounted to CZK 508,197,169.36, representing 75.7% of the total costs of the organisation. Compared to 2023, this is an increase of CZK 33,081,800. This development reflects:

- across-the-board increase in personal remuneration by CZK 1,000 from June 2024;
- payment of exceptional bonuses up to 100% of gross salary according to the financial possibilities of the services;
- 10% increase in staff tariffs by the end of 2024.

As a result of the floods in September 2024, it was necessary to pay extraordinary bonuses of approximately CZK 3,000,000 to employees who participated in the damage repair and subsequent clean-up. These remunerations were covered by the C subsidy scheme announced by the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs, the total amount of which was CZK 12,414,409.

Other key cost items include:

- Services: CZK 51,269,584.16 (8.1%);
- Material costs: CZK 38,780,308.62 (5.8 %);
- Energy: CZK 23,795,398.54 (3.5 %);
- Repairs: CZK 21,967,621.36 (3.3 %);
- Depreciation: CZK 18,650,194.82 (2.8 %).

Depreciation continues to be a major challenge for our organisation as it is not a deductible expense for most public sector donors, which accounts for over 80% of our income. Nevertheless, we try to cover them as much as possible from our own resources, because depreciation serves as a financial source for participation in investment projects.

REVENUE AND FINANCING

The main sources of funding in 2024 were, as in previous years, subsidies from Chapter 313 of the state budget and the subsidy programme of the Moravian-Silesian Region (MSR) "Support for Social Prevention Services for 2022-2024".

From Chapter 313 of the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs, we received funds in the total amount of CZK 328,257,607.29 (CZK 14,011,093.07 more than in 2023), of which:

- CZK 312,904,807.29 through the Moravian-Silesian Region;
- CZK 15,352,800 through the South-Moravian Region.

Subsidies from the MSR project "Support for social prevention services" amounted to CZK 51,775,347.32. We further received:

- CZK 16,909,000 to finance the current operating expenditure of social services and the MSR drug policy;
- CZK 3,968,383.55 from other MSR subsidy titles;
- CZK 2,071,506 from the budget of the South Moravian Region.

The Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs of the Czech Republic provided us with a subsidy of CZK 9,039,700 from the B scheme to support the EXIT. Other important resources were:

- subsidies and donations from municipalities: CZK 51,554,001.3 (7.72% of total revenue);
- repayable financial assistance from the MSR Social Services Fund: CZK 36,25,00 (CZK 8,769,000 less than in 2023);
- contributions of users: CZK 104,713,674.88 (15.7% of total revenue, a decrease of 1.3% compared to 2023).

A more detailed breakdown of the revenue is shown in the table "Breakdown of the SD's revenue in 2024".

ECONOMIC RESULTS

In 2024, the total costs of the Silesian Diaconate amounted to CZK 671,321,452.83, the revenues amounted to CZK 667,448,261.6. The result therefore shows a loss of CZK 3,873,191.23.

Investment Activities

The year of 2024 was exceptionally rich for the Silesian Diocese in terms of investment projects that contributed to the quality improvement of services provided.

The biggest investment of the year was the reconstruction of the SAREPTA Home for the Elderly in Komorní Lhotka. The cost of this reconstruction amounted to CZK 28,093,006.81. All eligible expenditure was financed by the European Union under the National Recovery Plan and the Moravian-Silesian Region. The assets of SAREPTA have also been expanded by a new Fiat Ducato 13 with a lifting platform worth CZK 235,000 for transporting lunches, and two reheating trolleys for transporting food carriers for CZK 578,380, paid for from own resources. In addition, the Moravian-Silesian Region provided a subsidy of CZK 359,602 for the Rhapsody medical bath for assisted bathing. Another significant investment was the purchase of a building in Český Těšín at 262 Dukelská street. A bank loan was used to purchase the building, including the adjacent land.

In the Rainbow House in Ostrava, the Maxi Move Dps floor hoist for moving clients was purchased from own resources for CZK 189,539 and a deposit of CZK 480,675 was paid for the installation of air conditioning. The total investment in the air-conditioning system amounts to CZK 1,040,000, where 80% of the costs will be covered by the Moravian-Silesian Region within the Programme for the Support of the Quality Improvement of the Social Services provided in the Moravian-Silesian Region for 2024 (QSS).

In the Bruntál and Krnov Region, the construction of therapeutic gardens for the EFFATHA Social-therapeutic Workshops in Krnov and the BENJAMÍN Day Care Centre in Krnov has begun. The Ministry for Regional Development of the Czech Republic contributed 95% of the costs through the IROP programme, while CZK 946,226 was invested by the end of 2024.

In the SALOME Centre in Bohumín, unused premises were converted into a room to support the sensory integration of children and young people with disabilities. The investment in the amount of CZK 797,799 was supported by the Programme for the Support of the Quality Improvement of the Social Services provided in the Moravian-Silesian Region for 2024 (QSS) and private donors and individuals are also participating within the announced fund-raiser.

Other significant investments included:

- Thermal insulation of the building of the BETHEL Centre in Třinec, at 191 Frýdecká street. The total cost amounted to CZK 1,476,334.21, with the Moravian-Silesian Region contributing CZK 1,000,000 from the subsidy title “the Quality Improvement of the Social Services” (QSS), the rest was financed from the SD’s own resources.

- Installation of electric door openers in the EBEN-EZER Centre in Český Těšín for the safety of users on the protected escape route. The total cost was CZK 1,215,995.63, while the Moravian-Silesian Region contributed CZK 967,000 from the same programme – the project “Safety and Dignity for Users of the EBEN-EZER Centre in Český Těšín”. The difference was covered from the SD’s own resources.

- Reconstruction of the building of the SÁRA Shelter in Třinec, including waterproofing of the foundations, repair and insulation of the roof and creation of an entrance to the roof. The total investments amounted to CZK 1,533,006.13, with the Moravian-Silesian Region contributing CZK 1,000,000 from the subsidy programme for the quality improvement of social services, the rest was financed from the SD’s own resources.

In 2024, the Silesian Diocese also focused on the modernisation of its fleet of vehicles:

- Four passenger cars were purchased with the support of the Moravian-Silesian Region in the amount of CZK 887,600. The purchased cars serve the Tabita Personal Assistance in Třinec, the Elim Care Service in Ostrava and the Rút Social Rehabilitation in Bohumín. The Statutory City of Ostrava also participated in the co-financing, contributing CZK 74,300 for a vehicle for the Elim Care Service in Ostrava.

- The fourth vehicle was purchased for the Třinec region for CZK 637,830, financed through a loan.

- The fleet was also expanded by an alternative fuel vehicle for the EXIT Therapeutic Community in Komorní Lhotka. This vehicle was purchased from the European Union resources within the IROP 2021-2027 programme and from the state budget and its price amounted to CZK 909,859.5.

Other investments worth mentioning include:

- Purchase of the Dell PowerEdge server for the headquarters of the Silesian Diocese for CZK 51,041.

- Expenditure on project documentation, feasibility studies, etc.

In 2024, total investment costs of the Silesian Diocese amounted to **CZK 44,999,454.99.**

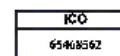

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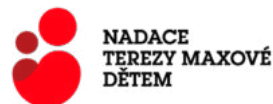
